THE PRICE OF RENEWABLES HAS FALLEN SIGNIFICANTLY

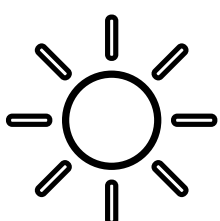
Renewables are cheaper than ever. PURPA's outdated regulations lock in high prices for customers.
